Literacy Myths

Myth: Young People entering the workforce will have the requisite skills necessary to meet the technological and literacy demands of a modern workplace, and will effectively fill the spots previously filled by the Baby Boomer.

Fact: Employers face a workplace with fewer young people aged 20-39 than in the past. Furthermore, the forecast is for a decline in the share of that age group from 32% in 1996 to 26% in 2015. Conversely, those aged 50-64 will increase from 14% to 21% over the same period. Employers will need to train and retrain workers already in the labour force (The Economic Benefits of Improving Literacy Skills in the Workplace, Conference Board of Canada, 2007) Additionally, youth require upgrading, with more than one third of Canadians age 16-25 having low literacy (International Adult Literacy and Skills Survey, Statistics Canada, 2005)

Recipe Corner

Turkey Vegetable Soup with Egg Noodles

Ingredients:

- 2 tsp olive or vegetable oil
- 2 leeks, cleaned and chopped
- 2 carrots, peeled and chopped
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 stalk of celery, chopped
- 3 or 4 cups cooked turkey, cubed
- 2 -4 bay leaves
- 2 tsp thyme
- ½ tsp salt, ¼ tsp pepper
- 8 cups broth
- 6 ounces uncooked egg noodles
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley

Instructions:

Heat oil in large stock pot. Add leeks, carrots, garlic and celery and saute 4 minutes. Add turkey, bay leaves, thyme, salt and pepper and stir to mix well. Add broth and bring mixture to a boil. Reduce heat and partially cover and simmer for 10 minutes.

Return mixture to a boil and add noodles. Cook 10 minutes or till noodles are soft. Stir in peas and simmer 1 minute.

Remove from heat, discard bay leaves and stir in parsley.

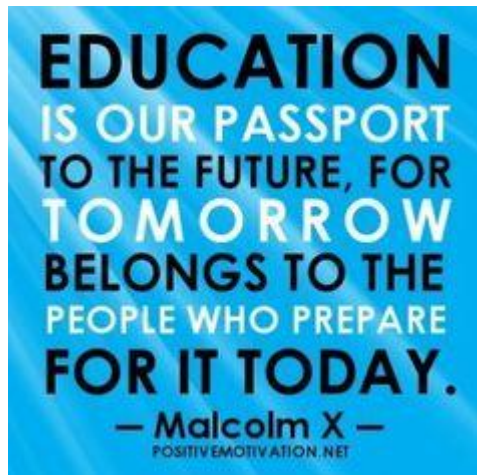
